I. GENERAL INFORMATION

The City of Memphis and Shelby County Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) is seeking proposals from interested and qualified Community Blight Conditions and Safety Study Services entities to conduct a study of community conditions of the Binghampton Tax Increment Financing (TIF) area (see map of area in Exhibit A). The study will include light readings as well as point-based data collection of blight and pedestrian/community hazards. The term of the contract will begin and expire in accordance with the length of the study.

Background

The Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) is a joint City of Memphis (City) and Shelby County (County) entity authorized under the provisions of the State of Tennessee "Community Redevelopment Act of 1998". The Memphis City Council and Shelby County Board of Commissioners by joint resolution and ordinance established the CRA along with its Bylaws, and Board of Directors in 2001. The agency was established for the purpose of improving the quality of life through the removal of blight and provision of affordable housing within the City and County. Although created in 2001, the CRA was set up as a stand-alone entity, with policies, procedures, accounts, and staff in FY 2017-18. There are currently four neighborhood TIF redevelopment programs, Uptown, Binghampton, Soulsville, and Klondike neighborhoods and the Highland Row TIF, a single project community redevelopment area which includes a mixed-use facility and a parking structure.

The Binghampton TIF district was created in 2017, and the Binghampton TIF Implementation Strategy Report outlines community goals and priorities for using TIF funds to: build strong community spaces; encourage a clean, activated and attractive neighborhood; provide more affordable housing opportunities and commercial spaces; and support a safe and connected neighborhood with improved transportation infrastructure. Completion of a Community Blight Conditions and Safety Study will provide baseline information on blight and pedestrian safety conditions which can be used to measure progress in improving these conditions over time as TIF funds are invested.

II. REQUESTED SCOPE OF SERVICES

Purpose

To select the best-qualified proposer and cost-efficient proposal for award of a professional services agreement for data collection and preparation related to a community blight conditions and safety study for the Binghampton neighborhood.

Services Required

The Binghampton Community Blight Conditions and Safety Study will include the following:
☐ Lighting condition measurements for all public sidewalks.
☐ Point-based data collection on all infrastructure issues in the right of way (sidewalks, streetlights,
utility poles, roadways, crosswalks, storm drains, etc.)
☐ Point-based data collection on other blight and community safety issues (weeds, vacant structures,

blighted structures, code violations, graffiti, evidence of public drinking or drug use, etc.)

All data will need to have geographic identifiers so that it can be mapped using a Geographic Information System (GIS).

Qualified firms should have experience with neighborhood-level blight analysis work including right of way light measurements, infrastructure conditions, and markers of community/pedestrian safety. Familiarity with concepts of Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) is also preferred.

Deliverables

Following the completion of the field study data collection, the firm will provide to the CRA a
deliverable of:
☐ Shapefile & .xlsx containing all light-reading points/data
□.Zip of all corresponding light-reading photographs
☐ Shapefile & .xlsx containing all collected blight and community/pedestrian safety points and data
☐ .Zip of all corresponding blight and community/pedestrian safety photographs

III. QUALIFICATIONS AND SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Respondents are expected to review, examine and understand the Scope of Services and all instructions contained in this RFPQ. The proposal packet must be signed by the duly authorized representative of the firm.

Submission Format

The submittal should be organized by the topics described below and submitted in the same order.

Content of the Proposal

□ Cover Letter

- o Identify the solicitation by its name: *Binghampton Community Blight Conditions* and Safety Study Services
- Letter head and/or footer should include the Respondent's name, address, and telephone number.

☐ Management Summary Narrative

- Identify the number of years in business, a brief historical summary of the firm, location of primary office, and information regarding the firm's mission or corporate philosophy.
- o Please provide examples of experience in providing similar professional services to governmental or non-profit entities.

☐ Project Team

- o Provide an organizational chart indicating the staff who will be involved in this project, their title and anticipated role in the project.
- o Indicate who will be the primary contact for the project.

 Provide resumes for each staff member who will be assigned to this project, indicating their educational background, professional status, experience and duration of time with the firm.

□ Proposal & Cost Estimate

- Description of services to be performed
- o Timeline & task framework for completion
- o Defined pricing & billing terms (lump sum, time & materials, etc.)
- o Any additional services to be provided or available

□ References

o Provide a list of not less than two (2) references that have recent knowledge of the firm(s) past performance, quality of work, and ability to perform.

□ Attachments/Forms





Exhibit A
